Immunization Requirements for OBU Students

Please submit immunization records to Med Proctor. You can find information for uploading your records on the Health Services page on the OBU website.

The following vaccinations are required by the State of Oklahoma for postsecondary education:

- Measles, Mumps Rubella (MMR) 2 doses
- Hepatitis B- 3 doses

Required only for students living on campus:

• Meningococcal- 1 dose

If you would like to fill out an exemption form, please go to <u>https://www.okbu.edu/student-life/documents/vaccine-</u>waiver.pdf. Please fill out the form and upload to Med Proctor.

- The Campus Nurse's office is in GC 206 Anna.morris@okbu.edu or 405-585-5263
- A virtual clinic (TEAM Clinics) is offered and students can receive urgent/ primary care without leaving the campus.
- Access to high-quality and immediate telemedicine during the hours of 9 a.m 7 p.m. Monday through Thursday.
- TEAM Clinics is covered by most insurance companies and no money needs to be exchanged during your visit.
- The campus nurse will set up an appointment to Zoom with a licensed healthcare provider.
- The technology allows the provider to listen to heart & lung sounds through the stethoscope and view the ears, nose and throat with the camera attached to the otoscope.

• The nurse can test for Flu A+B, Rapid Strep, Urine Analysis, and COVID-19. We can perform the rapid onsite COVID-19 antigen test.

The Milburn Student Success Center

- The Center includes Student Success, Academic Advising and University Testing and is committed to the success of every student.
- The Milburn Center staff and resources are available to assist students of all majors, classifications, and academic needs with comprehension of course material as well as in the development of study, research, analytical, reading, writing and critical thinking skills.
- Student Success offers help with writing assignments and academic support in core subjects as well as Mathematics, Science, Business, Religion, Music, and Nursing.
- Student Success also provides aid in research, organizing study groups and academic feedback.
- In addition, the Center provides academic advising to those undeclared or in the process of changing majors.

The Milburn Success Center is located on the third floor of the library.

Business Services Information

Rapid Messaging System (RMS)

- Through the OBU RMS, students, faculty and staff are notified regarding weather, emergency, and safety issues throughout the year.
- Students are automatically registered in the system using the mobile phone number provided during the enrollment process and the students' OBU email address.
- Students should check their contact information within the system to make sure it is current and should update it any time their contact information changes.
- While registration for OBU's RMS is only available to current students, faculty, and staff members, students may log on to the system at <u>http://www.okbu.edu/rms</u> and add your contact information as well.
- The web page will prompt the student to provide his or her OBU email address and password.
- Up to five contact phone numbers or email addresses can be registered per person.

Payment of Tuition and Fees

- A student can access his/her account by logging into Self Service Banner at any time.
- Once logged in, students may also grant access to their account information to authorized users (e.g., parents).
- To set up authorized users, the student will log in to Self Service Banner, select "Student", "Billing and Payments", and then "View Student Charges" which will pull up summary information for the student's account.
 - On this page, the student will select "Send a payer invitation" in the Payment Plans section and set up the appropriate information for the authorized user. This allows parents to view account information, make online payments, sign up for payment plans and receive email notification when monthly statements have been generated.
- Authorized users' log in at https://commerce.cashnet.com/okbupay.

OBU Utilizes an E-billing Process

- Statements are generated around the middle of each month and are available for viewing once logged in to the student account.
- Students will receive an email notification when that monthly statement is available to view online.
- Established authorized users will also receive email notification that the statement is available online.
- Authorized users may make payments on a student's account using a check or a credit card.
- Additionally, the cashier's window in Owens Hall is open Monday through Friday from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm to accept cash or check payments.
- Check payments may also be mailed to the attention of the Bursar's office at 500 W. University, Shawnee, OK 74804.
- Student accounts are due in full the first day that classes start; however, accounts may be paid in installments over the course of a semester utilizing one of OBU's payment plans.

- Students may sign up for a payment plan by logging into Self Service Banner, selecting "Billing and Payments", and then select "View Payment Plan Options" from the Overview page.
- Authorized users may also sign the students up for a payment plan by logging in at <u>https://commerce.cashnet.com/okbupay</u>.

The Academic Center can also reset passwords for Banner Self Service; however, please be aware that only the student may reset a Banner Self Service password.

Information You Might Want to Know to Help Your Student

Chapel

- Students are required to achieve a total of ninety-six (96) chapel credits. Typically, each chapel program is worth one credit.
- All academic requirements must be met, including satisfying the chapel attendance policy, for a student to participate in commencement, graduate, and receive a diploma.
- The number of chapel requirements is prorated for students who attend fewer than eight (8) fall/spring semesters.

Check Cashing/ATM

- There is a \$25 charge for returned checks.
- Most local banks have checking accounts designed for students.
- Bison Federal Credit Union provides an ATM on campus in the Geiger Center.

FERPA: The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act

This Federal law protects the privacy of student education records.

- Your student must sign a form to give OBU professors and administrators permission to share his/her educational records (e.g., how they are doing in class).
- This is a required form provided during the admissions process.

Laundry Facilities

Each residential facility has washers and dryers - free, no coins required!

Part-Time Jobs

A list of on-campus and off-campus jobs are listed on <u>OBU Career</u> <u>Portal</u>. The student will use their OBU email address and assign a password.

Student Payroll/On-Campus Employment

- Students who are employed on campus are paid every two weeks.
- The payroll period ends on a Saturday and students are paid the following Friday.
- Students may choose to have a payroll deduction applied to their tuition account.
- Prior to beginning work, each student must complete the following forms and can be found at https://www.okbu.edu/hr/forms.html:
 - o Federal & Oklahoma Forms W-4 for withholding purposes
 - o Federal Form I-9 to verify employment eligibility

****There are identification requirements;** please see https:// www.okbu.edu/hr/documents/i-9-form.pdf to ensure proper documentation is in hand - work on campus cannot begin until all documentation is received.

- o Student Employee Confidentiality and Work Agreement
- o Direct Deposit Authorization form (Students are required to have their paycheck deposited directly into their bank account by electronic funds transfer. This can be set up in the Payroll Office and will require either a copy of a voided check, or screen shot of online banking with full routing and account numbers. Any subsequent changes to bank account information also needs to be provided to the Payroll Office to ensure direct deposit information is current.)
- o These forms MUST be turned in to the Payroll Office in Owens Hall before a student can work on campus.
- International students are required to provide their passport and Form I-94, along with their social security card, and have the Student Employee Personnel Recommendation signed by the Director of International Students and Disability Services.

<u>University Police</u>

Oklahoma Baptist University maintains a University Police Department that is staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to provide police and fire prevention services for the university community. The Police Department is located on the corner of Midland St and Pottenger Ave.

- In addition, officers are available to assist students who have vehicle problems such as flat tires and dead batteries.
- The University Police Department cooperates with the Dean of Students in the enforcement of university regulations as published in the student handbook, and with local authorities in the enforcement of local and state statutes. The officers work with groups on campus to encourage students to follow safe practices that will protect their property and themselves.
- University policy prohibits the use or distribution of alcohol or drugs on the campus or at any school-sponsored activity. Possession or use of firearms, fireworks or incendiary devices on university property is also prohibited.
- Parking for resident students is available in lots adjacent to their residence hall or apartment and in the Event Lot, Noble Complex Lot, and Soccer Lot.
- All students are expected to register their vehicles and to abide by parking and traffic regulations.
- There are specific parking areas for residence hall students, apartment students and commuter students. Students will receive a permit of a specific color according to their classification status.
- Parking regulations
- Parking registration is free
- Students are required to register their bicycles. This can be done at the University Police Department.

Fines are assessed for violation of parking regulations, such as:

- parking in a fire zone or a restricted space
- speeding
- overtime parking
- not registering a vehicle and/or
- not attaching the registration permit to their vehicle
